EDUCATION SEMINAR
AT UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA JULY 24-AUG. 2

MISSOULA--

Over 70 in-state and out-of-state primary and secondary school teachers and administrators will participate in a seminar at the University of Montana July 24-Aug. 2.

The seminar, "Innovations in Education," will be co-instructed by two UM faculty members--Dr. Lyle L. Berg, director of Educational ~~Services~~ ^{Research} and Services and Dr. John J. Hunt, associate professor of education.

The program is a two-credit course open to both undergraduate and graduate students.

Topics on the agenda include modular scheduling, scheduling for varying time periods to fulfill a student's needs; multi-media, making the students task of finding the reference material easier by an automatic retrieval system; the non-graded schools, allowing a student to compete with his own peer group by not subjecting him to grades; the middle school or the junior high school.

Participants will also discuss team teaching and current trends in U.S. education.

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
