TIME'S FORBIS  
TO JOIN UM FACULTY

MISSOULA--

William H. Forbis, 51, a Time Magazine editor and correspondent for the past 19 years, will join the journalism faculty at the University of Montana as a lecturer in September.

Forbis, who was graduated with honors from the UM School of Journalism in 1939, is a Missoula native and was graduated from Missoula County High School in 1935. He served in the Merchant Marine from 1943-45 as a radio operator.

He began working for Time in 1950 as correspondent for Central America and northern South America and two years later became a contributing editor. In 1955 he was named associate editor and from 1959-67 was a senior editor.

For the past two years, Forbis has been the Time bureau chief in Rio de Janeiro.

Before joining Time, Forbis was a writer and city editor of the Panama American in Panama and a reporter and city editor of the Nation, also in Panama.

He has written more than 40 cover articles for Time as well as articles for Sports Illustrated and Fortune.

Forbis will teach the journalism school's magazine writing and editing courses. He succeeds Dorothy Johnson, who retired in 1967 to devote full time to free-lance writing.

Forbis is son of Mr. and Mrs. C.J. Forbis, 300 Blaine St., Missoula.
