TWO UM ALUMNAE
TO BE FLUTISTS
AT CAMP RECITAL

MISSOULA--

Two University of Montana alumnae will be featured in flute performances Friday (Aug. 8) during the Camp Faculty Recital at the University.

The recital which begins at 8:15 p.m. in UM Music Recital Hall, is sponsored by the UM School of Fine Arts, the University Department of Music and the Montana High School Fine Arts Camp as part of the Fine Arts Camp now under way on the campus.

University alumnae featured in the flute performances will include Connie Riepl, 2212 Donald Avenue, and Wanda Criger, 501 University Ave., Missoula.

Friday's recital is open to the public without charge. Guests will include the 211 and high school students and high school/eighth-grade graduates participating in the Montana High School Fine Arts Camp through Aug. 15 on the Missoula campus.

Miss Riepl, who is daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F. E. Riepl, 2212 Donald Ave., Missoula, will be featured on the flute in a number entitled "Danse de la Chevre" by Honegger.

Miss Criger, who is daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph D. Criger, 204--7th St. S.E., Sidney, will play "Night Soliloquy" by Kennan. The two young women also will be featured in a flute duet.

Miss Riepl, a native of Jacksonville, Fla., was graduated from Missoula County High School several years ago and she was awarded her bachelor's degree in music this year at the University in Missoula.

A candidate at UM for a master's degree, Miss Criger received her bachelor's degree at the University of Montana with high honors in 1968. She was graduated from Sidney High School, Sidney, several years ago.

Among others scheduled to perform during Friday's recital will be William M. Manning and Edwin Rosenkranz, assistant professors of music at the University of Montana.

Flute instructor for Misses Riepl and Criger is Dr. Charles W. Bolen, dean of the UM School of Fine Arts.

The High School Fine Arts Camp is under the direction of George D. Lewis, an associate professor of music at UM.
