UM BUSINESS SCHOOL
OFFERS TWO NIGHT
COURSES THIS FALL

MISSOULA--

Two courses will be offered at night during fall quarter at the University of Montana by the UM School of Business Administration.

"Principles of Insurance and Risk," course number BA 330, will be offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:30-9 p.m. beginning Sept. 30 in room 111 of Business Administration Building.

The other course is "Accounting Principles," BA 202, which is the second half of a two-course sequence, the first of which was spring quarter. The accounting classes will be Monday and Wednesday from 7:30-9 p.m. beginning Sept. 29 in room 109 of the BA Building.

The program is under the direction of Dr. Jack J. Kempner, chairman of the UM Accounting and Finance Department. Insurance course instructor will be L.E. Pease, an associate professor of accounting and finance. F.A. Henningsen, a UM professor of accounting and finance, will teach the accounting classes.

Dr. Kempner said students who are not registered for a degree program may register for one or both of the courses as transient or special students. Both courses may be taken for a total of \$73.

Each course carries three credits. The insurance course is open to anyone and the accounting course is open to anyone who has had the first course in the two-course sequence or who has background in basic accounting principles.

Any nondegree student who wishes to enroll in one or both courses should apply at the UM Admissions Office and register as a special or transient student. Additional information about the courses may be obtained by phoning Dr. Kempner at 243-4561.
