DR. REAM JOINS FORESTRY STAFF

Dean Arnold Bolle of the University of Montana School of Forestry has announced the faculty appointment of Dr. Robert R. Ream, assistant professor of wildlife management.

Before coming to the forestry school, Ream was a research ecologist for the University of Denver's Department of Geography and for the U.S. Forest Service's North Central Perest Emperiment Station in St. Paul, Minn.

He has a bachelor's degree in agronomy from the University of Wisconsin (1959) and a master's degree in botany from the University of Utah (1969). He received his doctorate in botany from the University of Wisconsin (1963).

Among Resm's major scientific interests are the application of ecological principles in wilderness management and the use of computer techniques to solve resource management orablems.

Pear is a member of the Ecological Society of America, the American Institute of Biological Sciences, Sigma Xi, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and the Wildlife Society of America.

Ream was born in Richland Center, Wis., in 1936. He and his wife Catherine will make their home in Missoula. They have one child.
