TO UM EVENING  
EXTENSION OFFERINGS

MISSOULA---

Two additional courses have been added to the list of extension courses at the University of Montana this fall.

Mary Margaret Courtney, supervisor of the UM Extension Division, said the new offerings include Foreign Language 101, Elementary Russian, five credits, and a seminar course in drug use and abuse, two credits, which is listed under two different departments, Psychology 491a or Pharmacy 599a.

The language class meets Tuesdays from 7:30-10 p.m. in room 336 of the Liberal Arts Building. The drug course meets Wednesdays from 7:30-9:30 p.m. in room 109 of the Chemistry-Pharmacy Building.

Miss Courtney says there still are openings in other extension classes offered this quarter. No openings are available in the following extension courses:

Art 125, Design; Education 494, Classroom Mathematics; Radio and TV 140, Introduction to Radio and Television; Sociology 311, Juvenile Delinquency; Communication 118, Practicum in Oral Expression; Communication 314, Discussion in Small Groups.
