UM ARTISTS EXHIBIT  
WORK IN TWO SHOWS

MISSOULA---

Theodore J. Waddell, a University of Montana art instructor, has combined efforts with two UM art school graduates to present two two-man art shows in Kalispell and Billings in October.

In the Hockaday Memorial Art Center in Kalispell, Waddell will join Nancy N. Ericksen, 1969 Master of Fine Arts graduate from Missoula, in exhibiting various types of art work.

Mrs. Ericksen will display her paintings and "soft sculpture" which she defines as "creative work with stuffed, 3-dimensional fabric."

Waddell, a 1966 art education graduate from Eastern Montana College, Billings, and a 1968 Master of Fine Arts graduate from Wayne State University, Detroit, Mich., will add a number of original pieces of sculpture. The exhibition will be open to the public through Oct. 25, with all work on sale.

EMC will host the other show in the gallery of the Student Union Building through Oct. 29. Contributing work to this exhibit in addition to Waddell will be John A. Armstrong, art education graduate from EMC and presently a graduate assistant at UM. He resides in Missoula.

Featured in this exhibit will be Waddell's sculptures along with paintings and prints by Armstrong. All work is original and on sale.

Waddell, 28, is a native of Laurel, Mont., and is the son of Ted Waddell of Laurel. The younger Waddell is married to the former Betty Leuthold, formerly of Laurel, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert E. Leuthold, now live in Columbus, Mont.
