UM JUNIOR
TO ADDRESS HELENA
LIONS, ROTARY CLUBS

MISSOULA---

A 21-year-old University of Montana junior from Great Falls will address the members of the Helena Lions Club on Tuesday and the Helena Rotary Club on Wednesday. Both meetings will be noon luncheons at the Placer Hotel.

Fred W. Traber, who was graduated from Great Falls High School in 1967, said the purpose of his visit to Helena is to provide an information service to adults in Helena about the University and student life on campus.

This is the fifth trip of the year that UM Student Ambassadors have made from the Missoula campus for the purpose of telling their side of the story about what they feel is happening at the University.

The problems that students are facing on many college campuses, issues that young people of today are interested in, and a look at campus facilities from the student viewpoint will be discussed by Traber, with a question and answer period following the talks at both Helena clubs.

Traber said he hopes "the two programs will lead to a greater understanding and appreciation of both today's college student and the University of Montana."

Traber's visit to Helena is cosponsored by the UM Alumni Association and the Associated Students at UM through the UM Student Ambassador Program. Traber is chairman of the ambassador program.
