CALIF. PROFESSOR TO DISCUSS "NUCLEAR PROLIFERATION" AT UM

MISSOULA---

Dr. Walter B. Wentz will lecture on "nuclear proliferation" Wednesday (Nov. 19) at the University of Montana.

The lecture, dealing with effects of the diffusion of nuclear weapons on national security, will be at 7 p.m. in room 11 of the Liberal Arts Building.

Dr. Wentz, 39, is a graduate of Claremont College and the University of Southern California. He now is a professor in economics at Claremont.

The lecturer has done significant research in nuclear proliferation, technology transfer in military and space, and the petroleum industry.

Dr. Wentz is a consultant to industry on economics, international relations and national security. He also serves as director of the National Aeronautics Association and the Federation Aeronautique Internationale.

He has written several books including "Nuclear Proliferation," "Market Economics" and "Market Studies."

Wednesday's lecture, cosponsored by the UM Department of Military Science and the Associated Students at UM, is open to the public without charge.
