PROPAGANDA FILMS SHOWING
TUESDAY AT U OF MONTANA

MISSOULA---

A collection of films issued by the German Ministry of Propaganda during World War II will be shown Tuesday (Nov. 18) at the University of Montana.

Entitled "Propaganda Films I," the showing is scheduled for 9:15 p.m. in the University Center Ballroom. The event is sponsored by the Associated Students at the University.

The films include an abbreviated version of "Triumph of Will," which documents the Nazi Party Conference at Nuremberg in 1934. It gives enlightening glimpses of Hitler, Hess, Goebbels, Himmler and other Nazi leaders.

Included will be an excerpt from "Pilots, Gunners, Radio Operators," a short film about the German air force; "Baptism of Fire," which deals with the Nazi conquest of Poland, and "German Newsreels," which includes scenes of occupied Paris and Hitler's triumphant return to Berlin.

The propaganda films were produced by Dr. Goebbels, founder of the Nazi Ministry of Propaganda. Dr. Goebbels' ambition was to turn the German people into a "Chain of souls." Photographic content of the films disguises the editorializing of the material. The films were highly effective in indoctrinating the German people.

Tickets will be on sale at the UC Ballroom entrance for Tuesday's showing.
