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Town-Gown series continues Thursday in Missoula

University of Montana President Robert T. Pantzer will discuss "Issues Confronting the University" Thursday night (Nov. 20) here as part of the continuing Town and Gown Dialogue Series.

The program begins at 7:30 p.m. at the University Congregational Church, 401 University Ave. It is open to the public without charge.

The series was established several months ago by a number of Missoula churches and a group of University campus pastors to stimulate understanding and foster a stronger relationship between the University and townspeople.

Previous programs in the series have included a discussion of the Black Studies Program at UM with Ulysses S. Doss, an associate professor of humanities and Afro-American affairs.

Dr. Ray L. Hart, chairman of religious studies at UM, discussed the religious studies department at the University in another presentation in the series and a panel composed of students and the general public and led by the late Benjamin B. Briscoe III talked about "Present-Day Student Concerns." Briscoe, the former president of the Associated Students at UM, recently died in a car-truck crash.

Rev. Jon Nelson, the Lutheran campus pastor, said each of the programs has been very successful and he said he hopes the Missoula community, including University people, becomes involved actively in the continuing series. Rev. Nelson is program coordinator.

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
