WOOD WASTE DISPOSAL SYMPOSIUM  
SET DEC. 3-4 IN WESTERN MONTANA

MISSOULA--

Specialists will evaluate tepee burner modifications and discuss fundamentals of combustion during the Wood Waste Disposal Symposium Wednesday (Dec. 3) in Kalispell and Thursday (Dec. 4) in Missoula.

The Kalispell program is slated for the Hennessy Chicken & Steak House, Sommers Stage, and the Missoula program will be at the University of Montana. Each one-day program begins with 8 a.m. registration. The UM program will be held in suite 361, rooms C, D and E, of the University Center.

Leo K. Cummins, an associate professor of forestry at UM and one of two symposium coordinators, said the program "is primarily for anyone involved in the forest products industry and those interested in the problems of waste disposal." Each symposium is open to the public both days.

Benjamin F. Wake, Helena, director of air pollution and industrial hygiene for the State Department of Health, has assisted Cummins in program planning. Wake also will be among the pollution experts to be featured in the symposium.

University President Robert T. Pantzer will welcome participants at the Missoula symposium Thursday at 8:30 a.m.

Two topics--"Evaluation of Field Examination of the Montana Tepee Modifications to Improve Combustion of Wood Waste" and "Review of Fundamentals to Improve Combustion of Wood Waste in Tepee Burners"--will be discussed at 8:45 a.m. both days by Dr. Richard W. Boubel, president of the Pacific International Section of the Air Pollution Control Association. Dr. Boubel also is a mechanical engineering professor at Oregon State University.

Other topics on the program include:

"Perspective for Tepee Burners to Meet Montana Regulatory Requirements," Wake and Dr. Boubel, 10:30 a.m.-noon.

"Other Alternatives for Waste Disposal," Dr. John P. Krier, professor of wood science and technology at the University of Montana, 1-1:45 p.m.

"Modern Wood Fired Boilers and Collectors," Fred Thiele, Bumstead and Woolford Co., 1:45-2:30 p.m.

"Modern Tepee Burner Control Systems," J.S. Lausmann, president of KOGAP Lumber Industries, Medford, Ore.

An open discussion session and symposium review is scheduled Wednesday and Thursday from 3:30-5 p.m.

A registration fee of \$10 per participant to cover a portion of symposium costs will be charged for the program.
