Commercial airlines are scheduled to fly 839 Montanans to the 1969 Camellia Bowl this weekend, according to Gary Hughes, manager of the athletic ticket office at the University of Montana here.

Hughes said a total of 1,833 reserved game tickets were sold through his office for Saturday's (Dec. 13) game in Sacramento, Calif., between the UM Grizzlies and the North Dakota State University Bison from Fargo. Game time is 1:30 p.m. Pacific Standard Time (PST) or 2:30 p.m. Mountain Standard Time (MST).

A total of 2,100 Camellia Bowl game tickets were made available to the UM ticket office. Hughes said that those not sold were returned to Sacramento Tuesday with the cash from the actual sales.

He said the fact that 839 Montana football fans are scheduled to go to Sacramento via commercial airlines indicates that most of the Grizzly fans may go by car or in private planes.

Earl Morgenroth, Missoula, chairman of the Century Club Camellia Bowl Boosters Committee, said Wednesday that \$11,300 has been donated so far in the \$12,000 fund raising campaign to obtain funds to fly the UM football team and band, Grizzly cheerleaders and two student body representatives to Saturday's game.

Mike Frellick, executive secretary of the UM Camellia Bowl Committee, said additional donations to the \$12,000 fund drive may be sent to the Camellia Bowl Boosters Committee in care of the University of Montana, Missoula, Mont. 59801, or interested fans may phone 243-2311 at the University.

University of Montana administrative representatives attending Saturday's game will include President and Mrs. Robert T. Pantzer, Mr. and Mrs. George L. Mitchell, Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence D. Stuart and Frellick.

Mitchell is UM administrative vice-president and Stuart is director of UM Information Services. The group leaves by chartered plane for Sacramento at 9 a.m. MST Friday. They are slated to arrive in Sacramento Friday afternoon.

First airliner to leave Missoula Friday with Grizzly football fans bound for Sacramento Metropolitan Airport will be the one sponsored through the UM Century Club. That plane is slated to leave Johnson-Bell Field at 7 a.m. MST, with Sacramento arrival time scheduled for 7:45 a.m. PST.

Other planes scheduled to fly Montana fans to California Friday for Saturday's game include:

Associated Students of UM plane, leaves Missoula 3 p.m. MST, arrives Sacramento 3:30 p.m. PST; KYLT-radio plane, leaves Missoula 8:30 p.m. MST, arrives Sacramento 9:20 p.m. PST. The ASUM plane will carry the UM band, cheerleaders and two student body representatives.

Another flight for Montana fans from Billings and Great Falls is scheduled to leave Billings at 2 p.m. MST Friday for Great Falls. The flight, sponsored under the auspices of United Travel Service of Billings, is slated to leave Great Falls at 4 p.m. MST for Sacramento and arrive there at 5 p.m. PST. UTS officials said several spaces still are available on the Billings-Great Falls-Sacramento flight.

A plane sponsored through the Mavericks, a group of athletic boosters from Missoula, will leave Missoula at 6 a.m. MST Saturday and arrive in Sacramento at 7 a.m. PST.
