Mrs. Fannie Milodragovich, an associate professor of home economics at the University of Montana, will be one of 12 speakers featured at a Missoula workshop on diabetic care for licensed practical nurses (LPNs) Friday.

Mrs. Milodragovich will speak on the special problems involved in the diabetic diet. Her presentation will begin at 3 p.m. Jan. 23 in the McLeod Room of the Florence Hotel.
