Thirty-three University of Montana students will participate Jan. 23-25 in stage productions in Havre, Chester and Whitefish.

The students are members of the UM singing Jubileers, the University Dance Company and selected members of the UM Band and Symphonette. The performances are sponsored by local groups in the respective communities with the cooperation of the Associated Students of the University of Montana.

An associate professor of music at the University, Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman, will conduct the performance of the featured work, "The Unicorn, The Gorgon, and The Manticore" by Gian Carlo Menotti. This work is subtitled "The Three Sundays of a Poet."

Dr. Mussulman also will direct the UM Jubileers in vocal selections from the "American Tribal Love-Rock Musical" HAIR.

Dance numbers, featuring modern dance and classical ballet, will include "The Planet of War," music by Gustav Holst; "Dying Swan," music by Camille Saint-Saens; "Mazurka," music by Frederic Chopin; "Pas de Deux," music by Henry Mancini, and "Love, Sweet Love," music by Carlos Chavez.

Co-directors and choreographers include Mrs. Dana C. Bunnell, an assistant professor in the/Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, and Mrs. Gay Blize, an assistant in the department.
