DON CRAWFORD APPEARING NIGHTLY AT UM FEB. 16-21

MISSOULA---

Don Crawford, rock and folk singer-guitarist, will appear nightly Feb. 16-21 at the University of Montana, Missoula.

The entertainer, brought to the University by the Program Council of the Associated Students as part of the Coffee House Circuit, will perform in the Gold Oak Room of the University Center.

Crawford is scheduled to appear from 9:15-10 p.m. and 10:15-11 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Friday and Saturday nights he will put on three shows, 10:15-11 p.m., 11:15-midnight, and 12:15-1 a.m.

Combining many styles--soul, primitive Mississippi delta blues, and rock--Crawford creates a style of his own. "I sing songs that I have written, and four or five by Leonard Cohen, Joni Mitchell, Muddy Waters and Bob Dylan."

Born in Berkeley, Calif., but now living in Canada, Crawford has played numerous clubs and coffee houses in New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Chicago.

Admission is 50 cents at the door. Free coffee will be served.
