LAW PROGRAM
SET FOR MARCH 7
AT MILES CITY

MISSOULA--

A one-day program will be held in Miles City on March 7 as a part of the Continuing Legal Education Program sponsored by the University of Montana School of Law and the Montana Bar Association.

The cooperative venture, known as CLEM--Continuing Legal Education--Montana, is open to lawyers, bankers and others interested in the subject matter.

Local arrangements have been made by the Southeastern Montana Bar Association. Bruce M. Brown, an attorney in Miles City, is regional chairman of the organization.

The program in Miles City will be held at the Town and Country Club beginning at 9 a.m. March 7. Registration begins at 8:30 a.m.

Robert E. Sullivan, dean of the UM School of Law, said half of the program will be devoted to the Federal Consumer Protection Act, which is frequently referred to as "Truth in Lending."

The remaining half day will be devoted to a discussion of the use of revocable trusts in estate planning. Each one-half day session will feature a film and two speakers.

Speakers for the Truth in Lending portion of the program, beginning at 9 a.m., will be C. Eugene Phillips, who is with the law firm of Murphy, Robinson, Heckathorn and Phillips, Kališpell, and H.W. Daniels, vice-president of Midland National Bank, Billings.

The speakers for the Revocable Trust segment of the program, beginning at 1:30 p.m., will include two Billings lawyers--Myles J. Thomas Jr. of Crowley, Kilbourne, Haughey, Hanson & Gallaher, and James R. Felt of Felt, Speare and Thompson.

Sullivan said the CLEM program is designed to take continuing legal education to six Montana cities, rather than scheduling a program in one central location. Other cities involved in the series will be announced.
