UM LAW PROGRAM
AT BILLINGS TO
FEATURE BANKER,
THREE ATTORNEYS

MISSOULA--

A Billings bank executive and lawyers from Helena, Great Falls and New Jersey will address lawyers, bankers and others attending a one-day legal program March 10 in Billings.

The program is part of Continuing Legal Education--Montana (CLEM) and is sponsored by the University of Montana School of Law and the Montana Bar Association. Tuesday's program will be at the Security Federal Savings & Loan Association Building, 219 N. 26th St.

Half of the program, beginning at 9 a.m. Tuesday, will be devoted to the Federal Consumer Protection Act, which is frequently referred to as "Truth in Lending." The afternoon portion, entitled "Revocable Trust," begins at 1:30 p.m. and will concern the use of revocable trusts in estate planning.

Participants will include H. W. Daniels, vice-president of Midland National Bank, Billings. Daniels will join Donald J. Rapson, who is with the law firm of Lautman, Rapson & Keane, Asbury Park, N.J., in presenting the Truth-in-Lending session.

Discussing various aspects of Revocable Trust Tuesday afternoon will be George T. Bennett of the Hughes and Bennett law firm, Helena, and William G. Baucus, a Great Falls attorney.

Robert E. Sullivan, dean of the UM law school, said the CLEM program is designed to take continuing legal education to six Montana cities, rather than scheduling a program in one central location.

Other cities to host the upcoming programs include Butte, March 19, and Bozeman, March 20.
