FRB GENERAL COUNSEL
TO SPEAK IN BOZEMAN
DURING LAW PROGRAM

MISSOULA--

Melvin L. Burstein, assistant general counsel for the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis, Minn., is one of three attorneys who will be featured during a one-day legal program in Bozeman on March 20.

The Minneapolis lawyer will join D. G. Stewart, vice-president of the First National Bank in Bozeman, in a discussion about the Federal Consumer Protection Act, frequently referred to as "Truth in Lending."

That portion of the one-day program begins at 9 a.m. March 20. The morning session and another slated for 1:30 p.m. will be held at the Baxter Hotel.

The afternoon session is entitled "Revocable Trust." Speaking on that topic will be Jack W. Burnett, a Billings attorney, and Harry Haines, a lawyer from Missoula. "Revocable Trust" concerns the use of revocable trusts in estate planning.

Sponsored by the University of Montana School of Law and the State Bar Association, the Continuing Legal Education--Montana (CLEM) sessions are designed to take continuing legal education to six Montana cities, rather than scheduling a program in one central location.

Robert E. Sullivan, UM law dean, said the Bozeman program was arranged by the Gallatin Valley Bar Association. McKinley Anderson, a Bozeman attorney, is regional chairman of the association.
