UM PROFESSOR TO STUDY THE
POLITICAL HISTORY OF FAMILY

Dr. Richard A. Chapman, an assistant professor of political science at the University of Montana, has been awarded a \$1,500 summer stipend for research in the humanities

Awarded by the National Endowment for the Humanities, the stipend will enable Dr. Chapman to begin preparing a book dealing with the conception and use of the family in the political theory of major writers from classical Greeks through Marx and Engels.

Dr. Chapman came to UM from the University of California at Los Angeles in September of 1965. He earned his doctorate at UCLA, writing his dissertation on Thomas Hobbes. His master's degree was received at San Jose State College and his A.B. from the University of California at Berkeley.

Dr. Chapman and his wife live in Missoula with their two children.
