Jug Beck, head wrestling coach at Sentinel High School in Missoula, will speak during the first annual Sports Medicine Seminar Tuesday at the University of Montana.

Beck, who has coached state championship mat teams at Sentinel 11 out of the last 13 seasons, will speak on and demonstrate techniques of preventing and treating injured ears of wrestlers between 3:45-5 p.m.

Three local physicians will participate in the one-day seminar--Dr. Robert R. Curry, director of the UM Student Health Service and Grizzly team physician; Dr. James E. McIntosh, a local neurosurgeon, and Dr. Robert P. Yost, an orthopedic surgeon,

Dr. Curry will discuss history and physical examination from 9:10-9:45 a.m. Dr. McIntosh will speak from 9:45-10:45 a.m. on cerebral hemorrhage and concussion, and Dr. Yost will discuss the diagnosis and treatment of athletic injuries from 10:45-11:30 a.m.

Registration for the program will begin at 8:30 a.m. Tuesday at the seminar site, room 361 of the University Center. There will be no charge for attending the program.

Vincent Wilson, professor of health, physical education and recreation at UM, said the one-day seminar is designed for doctors, coaches and athletic trainers, physical therapists and school health nurses.
