'EARTH DAY' TO CONTINUE FRIDAY AT U OF MONTANA; REP. ARNOLD OLSEN TO SPEAK

MISSOULA --

Earth Day activities Wednesday (April 22) at the University of Montana will continue Friday on the Missoula campus with Rep. Arnold Olsen, D-Mont., among the featured speakers.

Gov. Forrest H. Anderson will be featured during Earth Day activities Wednesday.

Anderson will discuss "Economic Development and the Environment" at 8 p.m. in the University
Theater. UM President Robert T. Pantzer is slated to introduce the governor before the lecture, which is open to the public without charge.

Olsen will discuss methods of financing environmental improvements at 8 p.m. Friday in the University Theater. The program is open to the public without charge. Dr. William G. Craig, UM academic vice-president, will introduce Olsen.

Members of a panel slated to quiz Olsen during the program include Ernie Corrick, an Anaconda Forest Products Co. representative; Jim Wenban, deputy regional forester, Region 1, U.S. Forest Service, and Don Aldrich, president of the Montana Wildlife Federation, all of Missoula.

Olsen also is scheduled to meet with University of Montana forestry students at 4 p.m. Friday in room 104 of the Music Building to discuss timber conservation and tree planting.

Two UM faculty members and three students are scheduled to quiz Anderson during the 8 p.m. program Wednesday. Panelists will include Maxine C. Johnson, assistant professor of business administration; Gordon Browder, a UM sociology professor; and the three students, Bill Leitch, zoology; Scott E. Fisher, botany, and Don Kendall, forestry.
