LEGISLATIVE INTERN  
APPLICATIONS DUE  
AT UM BY MAY 15

MISSOULA--

Student applications for the 1971 Legislative Intern Program are due at the University of Montana by May 15.

Dr. Leo B. Lott, chairman of the UM Department of Political Science, said at least four internships are available, each with a stipend of \$600.

The interns will live in Helena during the 1971 State Legislative Session and serve one or more legislators as administrative assistants. The students also will participate in disciplined academic study and research in legislative affairs during the 1970-71 academic year.

Students interested in the program should contact the UM Department of Political Science by May 15. Designation of interns will be made about June 8. Assignment of interns to serve with legislators will be made about December 1.

A formal written application should include transcript of academic record, reasons for interest in the program, personal background and special qualifications, if any, for an internship, statement of professional or career interest, the willingness to undertake the academic and special training, and ability to accept a reduced academic program during the 1971 winter quarter while residing in Helena.
