DR. EHRLICH TO ADDRESS
PUBLIC AT UM

MISSOULA--

Dr. Paul Ehrlich, an avid environmentalist, will discuss worldwide population problems at the University of Montana Wednesday (May 13), announced Lee J. Tickell, University Center Program Director.

Dr. Ehrlich's speech, scheduled for 8:15 p.m. in the UC Ballroom, is sponsored by the Associated Students of UM. His lecture is open to the public without charge.

A professor of biology and director of graduate studies in biology at Stanford University, Dr. Ehrlich's specialty is population biology. He is the author of more than 80 scientific papers and several books on this subject.

In "The Population Bomb," his most widely read book, Dr. Ehrlich contends that "in the 1970's the world will undergo famines--hundreds of millions of people are going to starve to death." He sees "population control as the only answer."
