A total of 33 University of Montana students and faculty recently were elected to the Alpha of Montana Chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma, a national scholastic honorary society of accredited schools of business administration.

The new members were honored at a luncheon in the University Center Thursday (May 21).

Membership requirements are a year in residence at the University of Montana, a grade point average of 3.5 (B-plus) for graduate students, 3.1 for juniors and 3.0 (B) for seniors.

Faculty members are eligible for membership after two years at UM.

The National Council of Beta Gamma Sigma allows its chapters to elect members from the top 20 per cent of the candidates for master's degree, the <sup>top</sup> 10 per cent of the senior class, and the top 5 per cent of the junior class.

New BGS members from the business administration faculty include Laurel Pease, an associate professor; William Patton, an assistant professor, and James R. Schwartz, an instructor.
