EVENSON TO PRESENT
MUSICOLOGY SESSIONS

Missoula--

Dr. Pattee Evenson will be the speaker at the musicology and theory sessions of the Western Division Conference of the Music Teachers National Association, scheduled July 19-22 at the University of Montana, Missoula.

Convention chairman Charles W. Bolen, dean of the UM School of Fine Arts, said the conference will also have sessions on voice, piano, organ and strings.

Dr. Evenson's topics include "Keyboard Music of the Baroque Era" and "Strings and Keyboard Music."

The musicologist is the author of "An Historic Anthology of Music." He is slated to record the musical portions of the work for Columbia Records with the American Symphony of Los Angeles.

His experience includes 14 years on the faculty of Eastman School of Music and teaching or administrative positions at the University of Michigan and San Diego State College. He has been a curriculum and accreditation consultant for the California State Board of Education.

Dr. Evenson is conductor of the Burbank, Calif., Symphony. For 19 seasons he was a principal trumpet player under Ormandy, Bernstein, Leinsdorf and other major conductors.
