GOVERNOR OF GIRLS STATE  
GIVES STATE OF STATE SPEECH

MISSOULA--

Racial problems, highway safety and conservation are among the greatest problems facing the mythical State of Treasure, Candi Fox, Girls State Governor of 1970 said Thursday at the University of Montana.

In her State of the State Address before a joint session of the Senate and House of Representatives of the mythical state, Miss Fox said that the treatment of Indians has caused a great racial problem.

"We must see what the Indians can do for us and we must do what we can for them," she said.

Miss Fox said she advocates increasing the size of the highway patrol as the primary method of increasing highway safety in the state.

She recommended the development of more tourist attractions in the state and said that four more national parks should be created.

Miss Fox also said that the mythical state should regulate the number and kinds of industries allowed in the state to prevent pollution of the water and air.

###
