ELECTS OFFICERS

MISSOULA----

Ginny Murphy of Butte was elected president pro tem of the Senate Thursday at the 1970 Girls State, in session at the University of Montana.

The Senate is being presided over by Benilda Caciari, Whitefish, who was elected lieutenant governor of the mythical State of Treasure Wednesday evening.

Karen Taylor of Billings is Senate secretary and Johna Wilson, Missoula, is sergeant-at-arms.

The 23rd Annual Girls State, meeting in the University Center, will end Sunday. The final days are filled with committee meetings, community activities, committee reports, introduction of bills and formal dinners as the Montana high school girls learn the workings of government through practical experience.

Mrs. Maxine Johnson, Missoula, assistant director of the Bureau of Business and Economic Research at the University of Montana, will be the featured speaker at the final Girls State assembly at 8 p.m. Saturday in the University Center Ballroom. Commencement will follow Mrs. Johnson's talk. The delegates are slated to leave for home Sunday morning.

While at UM, the girls, representing all Montana high schools, have been staying in Aber Hall, the University's newest high-rise dormitory.
