TO SPEAK AT UM JULY 8

NBC White House Correspondent Herb Kaplow will speak at 8:15 p.m., Wednesday, July 8, at the University Center Ballroom, the University of Montana, Missoula.

Mr. Kaplow, probably the most aggressive news questioner at presidential press conferences, has covered President Richard M. Nixon for 12 years. He has reported much of President Nixon's political life, including his activities and travels while he was Vice President and his campaign for the Presidency.

A 14-year network veteran, Kaplow has covered almost every major racial story since 1954, almost every important space flight, the political conventions and campaigns and several top international stories. In addition, he has covered an atom bomb test, the Cuban revolution, Congressional hearings, labor matters and scores of other major developments in Washington.

Kaplow joined NBC News as a news writer in 1951, and in 1952 was named Washington news editor for the NBC Radio Network's "News of the World." He became an NBC News correspondent based in Washington in 1954. He currently lives in Falls Church, Va., with his wife Betty and their three sons.

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
