SOCIETY TO MEET SAT. AT UM;
GOV. ANDERSON EXPECTED

Gov. Forrest H. Anderson is slated to attend a banquet Saturday (July 18) at the University of Montana honoring the Soil Conservation Society of America.

The governor will be awarded a silver medallion at the banquet in recognition of the 25th anniversary of the SCSA. The banquet, which begins at 7 p.m. in the University Center Ballroom, will highlight the one-day convention of the state SCSA chapter.

Twelve charter members of the state SCSA chapter will be awarded membership certificates during the banquet.

"Turning Points in Time: Land, Water, People" will be the theme of the state meeting.

How the land accommodates and relates to agriculture, recreation and living space will be among the topics discussed, said Richard Kennell, convention co-chairman.

Lectures and discussions for the soil conservation convention begins at 8 a.m. in the University Center and will continue through 5 p.m. Saturday.

Approximately 85 Montanans are expected to attend the convention.
