STRING SYMPHONY TO GIVE
CAMPUS CONCERT TUESDAY

A symphony of strings comprised of teachers attending the Music Teachers National Association Western Division Conference at the University of Montana this week will present a concert Tuesday (July 21) at 8:15 p.m. in the UM Music Recital Hall.

The orchestra is conducted by Joachim Chassman, Sherman Oaks, Calif., who will also be soloist for Sonata No. 3 for Violin alone by Ysaye and Concerto in G for Violin and Orchestra by Dittersdorf. UM Prof. Eugene Andrie will conduct the latter.

The concert will feature presentation of the School of Fine Arts Certificate of Honor to Fred W. Kuphal, whose Nardini-Kuphal Adagio-Scherzo will be played by the orchestra.

Kuphal, a founding member of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra, served that organization as violinist, music librarian and personnel manager from 1919 until his retirement in 1960 at the age of 80. He was a violin teacher in Helena before he moved to California.

Free tickets for the concert are available at the UM Music office and the Cartwheel.

After the concert the Montana String Teachers Association will honor Chassman and Kuphal at a reception in the University Center Gold Oak Room.

Celia Mae Bryant, Norman, Okla., national MTNA president, will speak at the conference banquet Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. in the University Center. Alpha H. Bolton, Salt Lake City, Utah, Western Division president, will preside.

Daytime events include a concert by winners of Western Division auditions for high school students and sectional programs given by duo-pianists Vitya Vronsky and Victor Babin, Cleveland, Ohio; pianist Bela Siki, Seattle, Wash.; pianist Dr. Elena Ferarri Barassi, Milan, Italy; organist J. J. Keeler, Provo, Utah; violinist Samuel Applebaum, New York, N. Y., and musicologist Dr. Pattee Evenson, Burbank, Calif.
