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HEAD START PROGRAM
SCHEDULED IN KALISPELL

MISSOULA--

The second lecturer in a Head Start series in early childhood education, will speak at Flathead Valley Community College in Kalispell Sept. 18 and 19.

Sponsored by the Head Start Regional Training Office at the University of Montana, Missoula, and FVCC, Dr. Alice Keliher, national Head Start adviser, will speak Sept. 18 from 4-6 p.m. and 8-10 p.m., and Sept. 19 from 9 a.m.-noon and 1:30-4 p.m.

Head Start is a development program for the preschool child, funded by the Office of Economic Opportunity as part of the Community Action Program. Eligible children come from low-income families.

Dr. Keliher helped establish the New York Citizen's Committee for Children, an organization which watches over the interests of New York children. She is also an active volunteer in other agencies concerned with child welfare.

The Kalispell program will involve nursery school, kindergarten and primary teachers as well as other Head Start personnel.

Mrs. Janet Roberts, Head Start regional training officer for the State of Montana, who has offices on the UM campus, urged participants to register early for the program.
