> ECONOMIC TOPICS SET FOR DISCUSSION SEPT. 13-17 NEAR BOZEMAN

MISSOULA-----

Montana clergymen, in an effort to understand economic problems of their parishioners, will meet Sept. 13-17 southwest of <u>Bozeman</u> for the third annual Montana Clergy Economic Education Conference (MCEEC).

The conference, which is sponsored by the University of Montana (UM) Foundation, is designed to help clergymen understand the economic problems around which many of society's woes hinge. The five-day program will be held at the Nine-Quarter Circle Ranch near <u>Gallatin Gateway</u>.

Conference registration will be at 4 p.m. Sept. 13.

Between 30 and 40 ministers from many faiths, and a similar number of laymen representing business and professional fields will be on hand for the program. Speakers will include men involved in business, labor and agriculture.

The Clergy Economic Education Foundation, established in 1957 at Purdue University, Lafayette, Ind., initiated the first clergy economic education conferences to bring facutal and comprehensive economic analysis to clergymen.

Initial speakers Sept. 13 at the MCEEC will be Conference Director Thomas J. Collins, director of the UM Foundation and of UM public services, who will present opening remarks at 7:15 p.m., and Dr. Ralph Kaczor, West Lafayette, Ind., executive director of the Clergy Economic Education Foundation, who will discuss the CEEF following Collins' remarks.

Other speakers and topics scheduled for next week's program include: Sept. 14--Dr. John Hicks, <u>Lafayette</u>, <u>Ind.</u>, executive assistant to Purdue's president, "An Overview of the American Economy," 9 a.m.; "Economic Growth and Stability," 1:15 p.m., and "Price and Market System," 7:15 p.m.
