FOR FALL QUARTER

MISSOULA--

Registration packets for enrollment of all former students and graduate students at the University of Montana are available weekdays through Wednesday (Sept. 23) in the first-floor area of the UM Lodge.

Wayne C. Woolston, registrar, said the packets, which include class schedules, will be distributed to new freshmen and new transfer students on Monday (Sept. 21) during their group meetings on campus, as indicated in the Orientation Program.

Woolston said he expects enrollment to reach about 8,500 this fall.

Classes begin officially Sept. 24 on the Missoula campus. Freshmen and transfer students register from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Tuesday. Former students register from 3-5 p.m. Tuesday and from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Wednesday.

Residence halls open officially at UM this Sunday, although new freshmen and transfer freshmen who have not previously taken the American College Test (A.C.T.) will be admitted to their dormitory rooms on Saturday. The A.C.T. begins at 8 a.m. Saturday in the Harry Adams Field House.

Thomas H. Hayes, director of UM residence halls, said rooms still are available on campus for about 350 students.

UM President Robert T. Pantzer and other UM administrators and faculty members will welcome freshmen and their parents to the campus this Sunday during a reception

from 3-5 p.m. in the University Center. Pantzer also is slated to address parents during a convocation at 2 p.m., and new freshmen during a convocation at 7 p.m. Sunday in the University Theater.
