U OF M STUDENTS BENEFIT
FROM FOX SCHOLARSHIP FUND

MISSOULA--

In 1968 an active Missoula clubwoman left the University of Montana a legacy of \$500,000 for a scholarship fund, enabling 57 students to receive up to \$500 during the 1970-71 academic year.

Mrs. Sadie H. Fox willed that her money should help deserving graduates of Montana high schools, specifying that they be of good character and have the aptitude and scholastic ability for furthering education at the college level. She stipulated that students receiving the Fox scholarship be in need of financial assistance and the money be divided five-eighths for women and three-eighths for men.

The University of Montana Foundation, in charge of private gifts and bequests to the University, turned the fund over to the UM scholarship committee, headed by the UM Dean of Students, now Robert R. Fedore.

The director of the Foundation, Thomas J. Collins, said Mrs. Fox was extremely interested in the education of young people and she had been giving scholarships to UM girls before her death.

Mrs. Fox enhanced her estate through wise investments, Collins said.

A Montanan since 1887, Mrs. Fox attended UM when it was a preparatory school in 1898. She earned a teaching certificate from the State Normal College, now Western Montana College. She taught school until marrying George F. Fox, an employe of the Anaconda Co. Forest Products in Bonner, in 1905. Mr. Fox died in 1946.

UM President Robert T. Pantzer and Mrs. Lucille Armsby, Missoula, are co-executors of the Fox Fund.
