MISSOULA--

An art exhibit at the University of Montana featuring works by Harold Balazs (pronounced Blaze) is receiving considerable attention, according to Patti Hirst, University Center publications director and graphic artist.

The display in the University Center Gallery consists of porcelain and vitreous enamels, silk screen, steam castings and other miscellaneous media.

Balazs, a native of Spokane, Wash., is currently working in collaboration with architects on works for public buildings. He has been awarded medals for craftsmanship from the American Institute of Architects.

"The variety of media used in the display," Mrs. Hirst said, "makes it well worth seeing. A great number of people have seen the exhibit already, and we hope many more Missoula area residents and others who are interested are able to visit the University and see the display before it closes on Oct. 25th."

Gallery hours are 1-5 p.m. daily, including Saturday and Sunday.
