DR. MEYER CHESSIN LISTED
ON TOXICOLOGY ROSTER

MISSOULA--

Dr. Meyer Chessin, a University of Montana botony professor, has been selected by the Toxicology Information Program (T.I.P.) at the National Library of Medicine for inclusion in the "Roster of Authorities in Specialized Subtopics in Toxicology."

Dr. Chessin was selected on the basis of his knowledge and professional experience in fields related to toxicology, the science which deals with poisons and their effects on living organisms.

The T.I.P. was created in 1967 as a result of recommendations made by the President's Science Advisory Committee. The roster will be used in the program as a file of specialists willing to provide counsel and interpretive information.

A native of New York City, Dr. Chessin received his doctoral degree in plant physiology from the University of California at Berkeley. He also attended Ohio State University, Columbus; Arizona State University, Tempe; the University of Costa Rica, San Jose, and the University of California at Los Angeles.

He is the author of more than 50 articles and has been listed in "Who's Who in the West" and in "American Men of Science." He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Association of University Professors, the American Society of Plant Physiologists, the American Biophysical Society and the Society for Tropical Biology.

A member of the UM faculty since 1949, Dr. Chessin teaches courses in plant physiology, plant viruses and radiation biology.
