SPEAK IN MISSOULA,
ALSO AT RESERVATION

MISSOULA--

Dr. James L. Hymes Jr. (pronounced Himes) a nationally known consultant, lecturer and author on early childhood education, will give several lectures at the University of Montana and at several off-campus locations Oct. 21-23.

He is slated to speak in Missoula Oct. 21-22 and on the Flathead Indian Reservation Oct. 23. A complete list of the speaking engagements will be released in several days, when program arrangements are completed.

Dr. Hymes, of Carmel Valley, Calif., is a graduate of Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. He holds graduate degrees in child development from Teachers College, Columbia University, New York, N.Y.

His most recent books include "The Child Under Six" and "Teaching the Child Under Six."

Arrangements for Dr. Hymes' speaking tour were made by Mrs. Janet C. Roberts, Head Start regional training officer at UM.

Program sponsors include the UM School of Education, private kindergartens in Missoula, the Montana Education Association, the Indian Community Action Program at UM, Flathead Indian Summer Head Start, and the Head Start Regional Training Office at the University.
