ATTEND MEETING  
IN SUN VALLEY

Five University of Montana faculty members recently participated in the 1970 meeting of the Rocky Mountain Modern Language Association at Sun Valley, Idaho.

Representing the UM Department of Foreign Languages were Dr. Keith A. McDuffie, department chairman, and Kenneth C. Brett, lecturer. UM English department representatives included Dr. Gerry Brenner, Dr. W. Coburn Freer and Joseph R. Millichap, assistant professors.

Papers presented during the meeting included the following:

Dr. McDuffie, "Cesar Vallejo in 'Trilce': Toward a New Poetics," for the Spanish and Portuguese section; Millichap, "Transubstantiation in 'The Pardoner's Tale,'" for the English Medieval and Renaissance Literature section, and Dr. Brenner, a paper entitled "Epic Machinery in Hemingway's 'For Whom the Bell Tolls,'" for an Ernest Hemingway symposium.

During the recent meeting Dr. McDuffie and Millichap were elected vice-chairmen of their respective sections for the 1971 RMLA meeting. Dr. Freer was named chairman of the English Medieval and Renaissance Literature section for next year's program.
