Miss Syroid, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter A. Syroid, 1934 Dixon, Missoula, will perform on the violin. She is a member of Mu Phi Epsilon, national music honorary for women, and is a recipient of a University music scholarship.

Miss Syroid's violin instructor is Eugene Andrie, professor of music at UM.

Swisher, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Swisher, 405 South 6th East, Missoula, a baritone, has taken voice lessons from Mrs. Jane Hevener Lea, an assistant professor of music at UM.
