LECTURES, OTHER PROGRAMS
TO HONOR BEETHOVEN

MISSOULA--

Dr. Hans Moldenhauer, Spokane, Wash., a collector of musical manuscripts, will present two public lectures this month at the University of Montana, commemorating the anniversary of Composer Ludwig van Beethoven's birthday, believed to be Dec. 16, 1770.

Dr. Moldenhauer will discuss "Beethoven from Primary Sources" at 3 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 8) in the UM Music Recital Hall (MRH). At 3 p.m. Monday (Nov. 9) in the MRH, Dr. Moldenhauer will lecture on "Anton von Webern: New Vistas."

The Spokane artist also will exhibit letters and documents pertinent to his lectures. He will display autographed or hand-written music manuscripts, all part of the Moldenhauer Archive.

The exhibit will be open to the public from 1-3 p.m. and from 5-8 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 8), and from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday (Nov. 9) in room 205 of the UM Music Building.

Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman, an associate professor of music at UM, will display parts of the Moldenhauer Archive in one of his classes, which meets at 9:10 a.m. Monday (Nov. 9) in room 105 of the Music Building.

Several other events on the UM campus will also commemorate the anniversary of Beethoven's birthday.

The Missoula Civic Symphony will perform an all-Beethoven concert at 8:15 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 8) in the University Theater. The program is under the direction of Eugene Andrie, a UM professor of music and symphony conductor.

The Montana Little Symphony, conducted by Andrie, will perform Beethoven's "Symphony No. 1" on Nov. 15 at 8:15 p.m. in the Music Recital Hall.

An all-Beethoven program is also scheduled for the Chamber Music Series No. 1 on Nov. 17 at 8:15 p.m. in the MRH.
