MISSOULA--

A seven station television and a six station radio network will broadcast the Grizzly-Bobcat football game from Dornblaser Stadium on the campus of the University of Montana.

Bob Ranstrom, director of special events for Western Broadcasting Co., said KGVO will originate radio and television coverage of the Montana-Montana State rivalry.

Ranstrom said television coverage includes six color cameras and facilities equipped for instant replay, stop action, isolated action and slow motion. KGVO will have a 25 man crew working the game.

Television sportscasters for the game include Jim Robischon, handling the play-by-play, and Bob Gilluly, as colorman.

Jim Rummel, sports director for KGVO, will handle the play-by-play over the six station Grizzly radio network. Dick Vick will be the colorman.

Stations on the television network include KGVO and KPAX, Missoula; KXLF and KTVM, Butte; KRTV, Great Falls; KOOK, Billings and KCFW, Kalispell.

The radio network includes KGVO, Missoula; KBOW, Butte; KARR, Great Falls; KCAP, Helena; KBYM, Billings and KBMN, Bozeman.
