AIR FORCE AWARD PRESENTED AT UM

MISSOULA--

An Air Force Association (AFA) Citation Award has been presented to the University of Montana and the Air Force ROTC organizations on campus.

The award was presented by David A. Levitch, president of the Spokane, Wash., AFA Chapter, during ceremonies conducted on the Missoula campus. Assisting in the award presentation was Clyde Stricker, Spokane, president of the Washington State AFA.

Other campus organizations besides the University itself receiving the award include the UM Department of Aerospace Studies; the Air Force ROTC cadets; the Arnold Air Society, an AFROTC service organization; and Angel Flight, the women's auxiliary to Arnold Air Society.

The award was presented in recognition of outstanding contributions in preparing young leaders for national security.
