UM FACULTY MAY APPLY FOR  
FULBRIGHT-HAYS, OTHER  
OVERSEAS GRANTS

University of Montana faculty members interested in lecturing or conducting postdoctoral research in foreign countries in 1971-72 under the Fulbright-Hays Program or two other programs are invited to consult Fulbright announcements.

Dr. Thomas P. Huff, an assistant professor of philosophy at UM who is Fulbright faculty adviser, has announcements of remaining Fulbright overseas opportunities or they may be obtained from the Senior Fulbright-Hays Program, 2101 Constitution Ave., Washington, D.C. 20418.

Dr. Huff said most/are lectureships, chiefly in biology, chemistry, economics, and business administration, engineering, the teaching of English as a foreign language, literature, mathematics and physics.

Lecturing appointments normally allow time for research. Several research awards are available in the Arabian Gulf States, Romania, and a few other countries. Travel-only grants are now offered for research in Israel in the humanities and behavioral sciences.

Information is also available on postdoctoral research awards for 1971-72 under programs sponsored by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization.

Faculty members who may be interested in Fulbright grants for 1972-73 are invited to complete a simple registration form as soon as possible. Copies may be obtained from Dr. Huff.

Registrants will receive the new announcement as soon as it is issued in the spring, in time to consider the possibilities and to apply before the closing date.
