SEATTLE ATTORNEY
TO SPEAK DEC. 5
AT TAX INSTITUTE

MISSOULA--

John T. Piper, an attorney from Seattle, Wash., will be one of the keynote speakers during the 1970 Institute on Taxation and Estate Planning in Missoula Friday and Saturday (Dec. 4-5).

Piper will discuss corporate problems at 10:40 a.m. Saturday in the Bitterroot Room of the Florence Hotel, institute headquarters. The institute is sponsored by the UM School of Law under the direction of Lester R. Rusoff, a UM law professor.

The institute, designed for lawyers, accountants, insurance underwriters and trust officers, will feature discussion of the 1969 Tax Reform Act.

Other institute speakers and discussion topics will include Ronald E. Andridge, Helena, agent for the Internal Revenue Service, "Depreciation;" John Huston, Seattle, professor and associate dean of the University of Washington School of Law, "Trusts."

The Certified Public Accountants speaking will include William G. DeGuire, Missoula, "Income Averaging," and Ward F. Junkermier, Great Falls, "Tax Preferences."

Attorneys speaking will include John M. Dietrich Jr., Billings, "Farm Problems;" Dale Forbes, Great Falls, "Capital Gains and Losses;" Sid P. Kurth, Billings, "Employee Problems;" and K. Dale Schwanke, Great Falls, "Charitable Contributions and Organizations."

Piper received his Bachelor of Law degree from the University of Washington School of Law in 1955 and was engaged in private law practice in Seattle from 1955-1959.

He earned his Master of Law Degree in taxation at New York University in 1960 and was a tax trial attorney for the Department of Justice from 1960-1962.

Piper was employed as a tax counselor for Weyerhaeuser Co. from 1963-1968 and is presently with a Seattle law firm.
