University of Montana assistant football coach Charley Armey, who is mentor of the yM defensive line stalwarts, may have more memories of the North Dakota State University Bison than any other Grizzly coach.

Armey served as student coach at the Fargo school in 1968-69, while he was a graduate student at NDSU. He received his master's degree there in 1969.

Armey, who coached the Montana Tech Orediggers to a 4-3-1 season in 1969 before joining the Montana coaching staff last February, may have something special planned for the Bison this Saturday when the Grizzlies meet NDSU in the 10th annual Camellia Bowl in Sacramento, Calif.

One thing is certain. Neither Armey nor any of his defensive charges will have to be reminded of the 30-3 conquest by the Bison over the Grizzlies in the 1969 Camellia Bowl.
