Grades: The final course grade will be determined by applying the University Catalog Grading Standard (A for excellent performance, B for above-average performance, etc.). Although we will not provide a grade for each exam, we will post the class distribution in terms of the number of questions answered correctly. At the end of the semester, we will determine the semester grade by assuming that those students who correctly answered the most questions will receive A's, those who miss approximately the class average number of questions will receive C's, etc.
