APPLICATIONS FOR \$1,000 HARRIS
SCHOLARSHIP DUE IN FEBRUARY

MISSOULA--

The deadline for applications for the \$1,000 George and Laurine Harris Scholarship at the University of Montana is Feb. 28.

The annual scholarship will be awarded for the first time for the 1981-82 academic year. The recipient will be selected in the spring of 1981 by a faculty committee appointed by the dean of the UM School of Education. Selection will be made on the basis of academic performance, motivation, character, ability and potential.

To be eligible for the award a student must have resided in Montana for at least 10 of the last 20 years or have graduated from an accredited Montana high school and must intend to enroll in a graduate program in education at the UM for the academic year following application for the scholarship.

The scholarship was established in the UM Foundation by the George and Laurine Harris Charitable Trust, which was set up under the will of Laurine Harris. She was a school counselor and a history teacher in Great Falls, and her husband, George G. Harris, was a founding member of the Great Falls law firm of Church, Harris, Johnson & Williams.
