ELLIS TO GIVE ORGAN RECITAL

John C. Ellis of the University of Montana music faculty will present an organ recital Tuesday, Feb. 3, at 8 p.m. in the UM Music Recital Hall. The recital is open to the public without charge.

The program will include Prelude and Fugue in G Major by Bach, "Priere" by Franck, Toccata and Fugue in D Minor by Reger, "Prelude for Rosh Hashana" by Berlinski, "Sketch in D-flat Major" by Schumann, and Prelude and Fugue in B Major by Dupre.

In addition, Ellis will perform a fortepiano duet by Johann Christian Bach with Chet Noll, a UM graduate assistant. The fortepiano used in the performance, built by Noll, is an exact replica of a late 18th-century Viennese instrument.

Ellis, an associate professor of music, is University organist and carillonneur. He holds bachelor and master of music degrees from the University of Michigan and a doctor of musical arts degree from the University of Kansas.

He will leave Wednesday for San Francisco, Calif., where he will play the same recital at Grace Cathedral.

Noll received an undergraduate degree from Whitworth College, Spokane, Wash., and is working on a master of music degree at the UM.
