FACULTY TO LECTURE AT  
UM DAYS APRIL 2-4

MISSOULA--

High school students will get a taste of college classes as they attend sample lectures given by University of Montana faculty members during the UM Days program April 2-4 on the Missoula campus.

According to Deanna W. Sheriff, coordinator of the UM Days program, the professors will deliver lectures as if they were teaching a regular college freshman class. She added that the students will be able to choose from more than 20 classes.

The lectures will be on topics like "Hypnosis," by John Watkins, professor of psychology; "What's Wrong with Russia" by Philip Maloney, assistant professor of foreign languages for Russian; "The Use of Rocks and Minerals as Evidence in Solving Crimes," by Raymond Murray, dean of the UM graduate school; "Voyager's Views of Jupiter and Saturn," by Thomas Margrave, associate professor of physics and astronomy; and "The Development of Constitutional Law on Obscenity," by James Lopach, associate professor and chairman of political science.

Three workshops for high school teachers, counselors, principals and superintendents accompanying their students also will be offered. They are "The Bianchi (Los Angeles Hillside Strangler) Case: Sociopath or Multiple Personality?" by John Watkins, professor of psychology; "Psychological Approaches to Stress Management," by Helen H. Watkins, counseling psychologist in the Center for Student Development; and a financial aids workshop by Don Mullen, UM director of financial aids.
